(معلقا) suspended action; temporary cessation or suspension

abide

(الالتزام) endure; put up with; bear; tolerate

abiding

(الالتزام) lasting for a long time; enduring; permanent

abjure

(تتخلى) renounce upon oath; abandon forever

ablution

(الوضوء) washing or cleansing of the body, especially as part of religious rite

abnegate

(انكر) give up or surrender; deny something to oneself

abnegation

(الزهد) repudiation; self-sacrifice; renouncing your own interests in favor of interests of others

abolish

(الغاء) cancel; put an end to; destroy completely

abolition

(الغاء) ending; act of abolishing; act of doing away with

abominable

(البعيضة) detestable; extremely unpleasant; very bad

aboriginal

(السكان الأصليين) being the first of its kind in a region; primitive; native

abortive

(فائتله) unsuccessful; failing to accomplish an intended objective; fruitless

abrade

(كشط) wear away by friction; scrape; erode

abrasive

(جلخ) rubbing away; tending to grind down

abridge

(اختزال) condense; shorten; reduce length of written text

abrogate

(تلغي) abolish, do away with, or annul, especially by authority

abscond

(يهرب) leave quickly and secretly and hide oneself, often to avoid arrest or prosecution

absent

(تغيب) go away or leave ; missing; not present

absenteeism

(الغياب) habitual not to appear, especially for work or other regular duty

abstain

(الامتناع) refrain; hold oneself back voluntarily from an action or practice

abstemious

(معتدل) sparing or moderation in eating and drinking; temperate

abstruse

(صعب) obscure; profound; difficult to understand.

abundant

(فيرة) plentiful; possessing riches or resources

abundantly

(تماماً) in great numbers; in a plentiful or sufficient degree; plentifully

abut

(تتأخم) border upon; adjoin; touch or end at one end or side; lie adjacent

(بالضعف) bottomless; very profound; limitless; very bad

accede

(الانضمام) agree; give consent, often at insistence of another; concede

accomplish

(الجمالية) nest of bird, such as eagle, built on a cliff or other high place

aesthetic

(الجمالية) elegant or tasteful; of or concerning appreciation of beauty or good taste

affable

(وكر نسر اجتماعي) easily approachable; warmly friendly

affect

(يؤثر) have an emotional or cognitive impact upon

affection

(المودة) fondness; tender feeling toward another; fondness

affectionate

(حنون) having affection or warm regard; loving; fond; kindly inclined; zealous

affinity

(تقارب) natural attraction, liking, or feeling of kinship; relationship by marriage

affirmation

(تأكيد) positive assertion; confirmation; solemn pledge by one who refuses to take an oath

affix

(يضعوا) fasten; append; add on; secure to something

(الكيمياء) medieval chemistry; magical or mysterious power or process of transforming

(الكوة) nook; small, recessed section of a room

algorithm

(خوارزمية) established procedure for solving problem

alien

(الغريبة) dissimilar, inconsistent, or opposed in nature; very different place, society, or person

alimentary

(الغذائية) providing nourishment; concerned with food, nutrition, or digestion

allay

(تهدئة) calm; pacify; reduce the intensity of; relieve

allege

(يزعم) state without proof; assert to be true

allegory

(الرمز) symbolic representation of abstract ideas or principles in narrative, dramatic, or pictorial form

alliteration

(الجناس) repetition of beginning sound in poetry

allocate

(تخصيص) assign; distribute according to plan

allude

(يلمح) refer casually or indirectly, or by suggestion

allusion

(إشارة) indirect reference; symbolical reference or comparison; metaphor

aloft

(عاليا) in or into a high place; high or higher up

alternate

(المنابوب) happening or following in turns; succeeding each other continuously; substitute

altitude

(ارتفاع) elevation especially above sea level; height

altruistic

(الإيثار) unselfishly generous; concerned for others

amalgamate

(دمج) combine; unite in one body; mix or alloy a metal with mercury

amass

(جمع) collect; gather for oneself, as for one's pleasure or profit

ambidextrous

(ضبطاء) capable of using either hand with equal ease

ambience

(اجواء) particular environment or surrounding influence; atmosphere of environment

ambiguous

(غامضة) unclear or doubtful in meaning

ambivalence

(التناقض) state of having contradictory or conflicting emotional attitudes, such as love and hate

amble

(المتنقلة) moving at an easy pace; walk slowly or leisurely

ambulatory

(المتنقلة) able to walk; formed or adapted for walking; not stationary

ameliorate

(التمهل تحسين) make or become better; improve; grow better

amenable

(قابلة) responsive to advice or suggestion; responsible to higher authority; willing to comply with; agreeable

amenities

(المرافق) convenient features; courtesies

amiable

(ودية) good-natured and likable; lovable; warmly friendly

amicable

(دية) exhibiting friendliness or goodwill; not quarrelsome

amid

(والاضطراب) in the middle of; among; surrounded by

amity

(الصداقة) friendship; peaceful relations, as between nations

amorous

(غرامي) moved by sexual love; loving

amorphous

(متبلور) formless; lacking shape or definition

amphibian

(البرمائيات) able to live both on land and in water

amphitheater

(المدراج) oval building with tiers of seats from central open space or arena

amplify

(تضخيم) broaden or clarify by expanding; intensify; make larger or more powerful; increase

amputate

(بتر) cut off part of body, especially by surgery; prune

anachronistic

(مسكن) having time error in story; erroneous in date; in wrong time

analgesic

(مسكن) serving to reduce sensibility to pain without loss of consciousness

analogous

(مفارقة تاريخية مماثلة) comparable; similar or alike

anarchist

(فوضوية) person who seeks to overturn established government; advocate of abolishing authority

anathema

(لعنة) solemn curse; someone or something regarded as a curse

ancestor

(سلف) forefather; forebear; forerunner or predecessor

ancestry

(أصول) family descent; series or line of ancestors; lineage

ancillary

(المساعدة) serving as aid or accessory; auxiliary

anecdotal

(التقريبية) having the character of an anecdote; of short story of interesting or humorous incident

angular

(الزاوي) sharp-cornered; consisting of an angle or angles; stiff in manner

animate

(تنشيط السلفي) endowed with life; alive; living; animated

animated

(متحرك) having life or vigor or spirit; filled with activity; in form of cartoon

animus

(العداء) feeling of enmity or ill will; attitude that informs one's actions; disposition

annals

(حوليات) chronological record of the events of successive years

annihilate

(إبادة) destroy completely; reduce to nonexistence

annotate

(تعليم) comment; make explanatory notes

announce

(اعلان) herald; give out; proclaim; make known publicly

announcement

(اعلان) formal public statement; act of making known publicly

annoy

(السنوي) disturb, especially by minor irritations; irritate

annuity

(الأقساط) annual payment of allowance or income; periodical payment, amounting to a fixed sum in each year

annul

(الغاء) make or declare void or invalid; reduce to nothing

anodyne

(المسكنة) source of relaxation or comfort; medicine that relieves pain

anoint

(أدهن) apply oil or similar substance to; put oil on during religious ceremony as a sign of sanctification or consecration.

anomalous

(شذوذ) deviating from normal or common order, form, or rule

anomaly

(شذوذ) irregularity; person or something that is unusual; departure from normal or common order

anonymous

(المجهولين) having no name; having unknown or unacknowledged name

antagonism

(العداء) active resistance; condition of being an opposing principle, force, or factor

antecede

(اسبق) precede; go before in time, and sometimes in place, rank, or logical order

antecedents

(السوابق) preceding events or circumstances that influence what comes later; ancestors or early background

antediluvian

(عتيق) antiquated; extremely old and ancient; belonging to very ancient times

anthology

(مختارات) book of literary selections by various authors

anthropocentric

(بالإنسان) regarding human beings as the center of the universe

anthropoid

(بالإنسان) manlike; resembling a human, especially in shape or outward appearance

anthropomorphic

(مجسم) having human form or characteristics

anticlimax

(خيبة أمل) letdown in thought or emotion; decline viewed in disappointing contrast with previous rise

antipathy

(الكراهية) strong feeling of aversion; dislike

antithesis

(تقيض) contrast; direct contrast; opposition

anxious

(حريصة) eager; keen; worried; uneasy and apprehensive about an uncertain event or matter

apathy

(اللامبالاة) lack of caring; indifference

aperture

(فتحة) opening; diameter of such an opening; hole

apex

(قمة) highest point; vertex; summit; climax

aphasia

(حبسة) loss of speech due to injury or illness

aphorism

(حكمة) definition or concise statement of principle; tersely phrased statement of truth or opinion

apiary

(مناحل) place where bees and beehives are kept, especially where bees are raised for their honey

aplomb

(ثقة بالنفس) poise; self-confident assurance

apocryphal

(ملفوق) untrue; of questionable authorship or authenticity; erroneous; fictitious

apogee

(المروع الأوج) the highest point; point in orbit most distant from the body being orbited

apolitical

(سياسية) having aversion or lack of concern for political affairs

apologist

(المدافع) person who argues in defense or justification of something, such as doctrine, policy, or institution

apostate

(المرتد) one who abandons his religious faith or political beliefs

apotheosis

(تألي) elevation to godhood; fact or action of becoming a god; an ideal example of something

appall

(فزع) depress or discourage with fear; grow faint or become weak

apparition

(الظهور) ghostly figure; sudden or unusual sight; appearance; state of being visible

appellation

(تسمية) name; title; act of naming; act of appealing for aid, sympathy

append

(إلحاق) attach; add as supplement or appendix

appliance

(الأجهزة) durable goods for home or office use; device or instrument for household use

apply

(تقدم) exert; put into service; avail oneself to;

apportion

(تقسم) distribute; allot; give out as one's portion or share

(الاعتماد) funding; money set aside for a specific purpose

(بالمناسبة) with reference or regard; in respect

aptly

(باقتدار) in a competent capable manner; in an apt or suitable manner

aquatic

(معقوف) consisting of, relating to, or being in water

aquiline

(معقوف) curved or hooked like an eagle's beak

arable

(المائية الصالحة للزراعة) fit for growing crops, as by plowing

arbiter

(الحكم) person with power to decide a dispute; judge

arboretum

(المشئل) place where different tree varieties are exhibited

arcane

(غامضة) secret; mysterious; known only to the initiated

archaeology

(علم الآثار) study of artifacts and relics of early mankind

archaic

(قديمة) no longer current or applicable; antiquated

archetype

(ركبه) prototype; original model or type after which other similar things are patterned

archipelago

(أرخبيل) group of closely located islands

architecture

(الهندسة المعمارية) art and science of designing and erecting buildings; buildings and other large structures

ardent

(شاقة) displaying or by strong enthusiasm or devotion; passionate

arduous

(شاقة) demanding great effort or labor; difficult

arid

(القاحلة) dry; lacking moisture, especially having insufficient rainfall to support trees or plants

aristocracy

(الأرستقراطية) hereditary nobility; privileged class

armada

(أرمادا) a fleet of warships; a large group of moving things

aroma

(رائحة) fragrance; scent; pleasant characteristic odor, as of a plant, spice, or food

aromatic

(العطرية) fragrant or sweet-smelling; caused by fragrant odor

arousal

(الإثارة) act of awaking from sleep; arousing from what is like sleep

arouse

(إثارة) excite; stimulate; awaken from or as if from sleep

arraign

(استجاب) officially charge someone in a court of law

arrears

(المتأخرات) being in debt; unpaid, overdue debt or an unfulfilled obligation

arrogate

(تنتج) claim without justification; claim for oneself without right

arroyo

(المتغطرة ارويو) deep gully; a dry gulch; brook or creek; watercourse

arthritis

(التهاب المفاصل) inflammation of a joint or joints

article

(المادة) essay; editorial; individual thing or element of a class

articulate

(التعبير) expressing oneself easily in clear and effective language

artifice

(حيلة) subtle but base deception; trickery; cleverness or skill; ingenuity

artisan

(الحرفيين) manually skilled worker; craftsman, as opposed to artist

artless

(جاهل) free of artificiality; natural; open and honest

ascendancy

(صعود) superiority or decisive advantage; domination

ascetic

(التقشف) leading a life of self-discipline and self-denial; austere

ascribe

(صقه) inscribe or dedicate; attribute to a specified cause, source, or origin; assign as a quality

aseptic

(العقيم) preventing infection; having cleansing effect

ashen

(الرمادية) ash-colored; very pale; consisting of ashes

askance

(بارتياب) with sideways or indirect look; Turned to side, especially of eyes

askew

(بميل) turned or twisted toward one side; at an angle

aspect

(الجانب) distinct feature or element in a problem; a way in which something can be viewed by the mind

asperity

(الحده) sharpness of temper; roughness or harshness, as of surface, sound, or climate

aspirant

(الطامحة) one who aspires, as to advancement, honors, or a high position

assail

(يهاجم) assault; attack with or as if with violent blows

assay

(فحص) analyze; evaluate; examine by trial or experiment; put to test

assembly

(تطمح الجمعية) gathering; meeting; a group of persons gathered together for common reason

assent

(موافقة) express agreement to what is alleged or proposed; accept

assiduous

(مجتهد) constant in application or attention; diligent; unceasing or persistent

assimilate

(استيعاب) incorporate and absorb into mind; make similar; cause to resemble

assist

(مساعدة) give help or support to, especially as a subordinate

assistant

(مساعد) helper; person who assists or helps someone else

assuage

(تهدئة) ease or lessen pain; satisfy or appease

astigmatism

(الاستجماتيزم) eye defect that prevents proper focus

astringent

(الشاعر) causing contraction; having the effect of drawing tissue together; stern or austere

astronomical

(نجمي الفلكية) enormously large or extensive; relating to astronomy

asunder

(اربا) into separate parts or pieces; apart

asymmetric

(غير المتماثلة) not identical on both sides of a dividing central line

atavism

(تأسل) resemblance to remote ancestors rather than to parents; deformity returning after passage of two or more generations

atavistic

(الإلحادية) displaying characteristics of previous cultural era or of previous ancestral form

atheistic

(تشریح) denying existence of God; godless

atrocious

(فظاعة) brutal deed; atrocious condition, quality, or behavior; monstrousness

atrophy

(ضمور) wasting away; decrease in size; reduction in the functionality of an organ caused by disease

attach

(ترفق) fasten; annex; be in contact with

attached

(مرفق) fastened together; joined by wall, especially by sharing a wall with another building; not freestanding

attainment

(تحقيق) something, such as an accomplishment or achievement; achievement

attenuate

(تحقيق تخفيف) make slender, fine, or small; weaken; lessen density of

attorney

(التدقيق) examination of accounts; adjustment or correction of accounts

auditory

(السمعية) of or relating to hearing, the organs of hearing, or the sense of hearing

auger

(اوجير) hand tool for boring holes; hollow drill used to take core samples of soil, ice

augment

(زيادة) make greater, as in size, extent, or quantity

augury

(بشارة) sign of something coming; art or practice of foretelling events by signs or omens

aureole

(الهاله) the outermost region of the sun's atmosphere; halo

auroral

(الشفق) characteristic of dawn; dawning, eastern, like new beginning; relating to the atmospheric phenomenon auroras

auspicious

(الميمون) attended by favorable circumstances; marked by success; prosperous

austere

(التقشف) strict or severe in discipline; severely simple and unornamented

authenticate

(مصادقة) prove genuine; establish authenticity of

(الاستبدادية) expecting absolute obedience; completely dominating another's will

(الانهيار) great mass of falling snow and ice

(جشع) greediness for wealth; insatiable desire of gain

(جزم) declare to be true; affirm

(نوره ولو كره الكافرون) reluctant; disinclined; turned away or backward; unwilling

aversion

(كره) firm dislike; turning away; avoidance of a thing, situation, or behavior because of dislike

aviary

(عقولة منتبهة) large cage, building, or enclosure in which birds are reared or kept

(طيران) art or science of flying; flight; aeronautics

avid

avoidance

(تجنب) keeping away from or preventing from happening

avow

(يعترفوا) declare openly; acknowledge openly, boldly, and unashamedly

avuncular

(عمي) in manner of uncle, pertaining to uncle; kind, genial, benevolent or tolerant

awkwardly

(مؤلم) in an uncomfortable, nervous or embarrassed way

awry

(منحرف) in a position that is turned toward one side; away from correct course

axiom

(اكسيوم) self-evident truth requiring no proof

azure

(الثرثرة) sky blue; light purplish-blue
